UPDATE: Pasco County Issues Evacuations for All Residents West of Little Road

~~All special needs and manufactured homes residents need to evacuate~~

PASCO COUNTY, FL ---- [Pasco County](#) has expanded its order for mandatory evacuations, as high winds are expected across the county and potential storm surge may occur along the county's Gulf Coast.

New Information as of 09/09/17:

- A **mandatory evacuation** has been ordered for residents living west of Little Road, effective 1:00 p.m. today, Saturday, September 9, 2017.
- A **mandatory evacuation** has been ordered for those residents living to the north and west of the following roadway boundary lines: north of 52 and west of Hicks Road; north of Kitten Trail to the intersection of Dennis Rd; west of Dennis Rd, following a northerly line to include properties west of Gopher Hills and west of Thomas Boulevard north to County Line Road, effective 1:00 p.m. today, Saturday, September 9, 2017.
- A **voluntary evacuation** has been ordered for the remainder of all evacuation zones, effective 1:00 p.m. today, Saturday, September 9, 2017.
- The hardened shelters of Fivay High School, Schrader Elementary, and the Emergency Operations Center will remain open and are not being evacuated.

Previously Released Information:

- A **mandatory evacuation** has been ordered for those residents living west of U.S. 19 effective at 10:00 a.m., Friday, September 8.
- A **mandatory evacuation** has been ordered for those residents living north of Fox Hollow Drive west of Little Rd. and south of Fox Hollow Drive west of Regency Park Blvd./Rowan Rd./Seven Springs Blvd. effective at 10:00 a.m. Friday, September 8.

- A **mandatory evacuation** order is still in effect for special needs residents, and those living in manufactured homes, mobile homes, RV's, and anyone living in a low-lying area or an area prone to flooding.
