

Transit Services

Transit buses operate in West Pasco County and East Pasco County. Many subdivisions, shopping centers, medical facilities and government offices are easily accessible. Call the PCPT information number for personalized assistance or to have a bus schedule mailed to your home.

Schedule Information

Check the schedule for the route you need. Select the direction and time you wish to travel. The times shown are reference points, but there are many bus stops between them. Use them to estimate when the bus will reach your stop. Arrive at the bus stop a few minutes prior to the scheduled departure time.

Schedules are available at the Zephyrhills Public Library, New Port Richey Public Library, County libraries, West Pasco Government Information Center, East Pasco Government Information Center, PHCC bookstore-West Campus, PCPT and many other locations. Transit Services

Fares

One-way fares and 1-Day passes for unlimited rides for the day on any bus can be purchased from the bus driver upon boarding. Other types of passes can be purchased from the Zephyrhills Public Library, County libraries, PHCC bookstore-West Campus, PCPT, and by mail. Visit www.ridepcpt.com for a complete list of fares and passes or see the PCPT green fare card.

Ride the Bus

Please use a nearby bus stop to catch the bus. Fold strollers and/or carts before boarding. Also, for your safety, please keep aisles clear. When on the bus, let the driver know you want to disembark approximately one block before your bus stop/destination by pulling down on the cord located near the window.

Bikes on Buses

You can put your bike on a bike rack that's mounted on the bus and take it with you on any PCPT transit route. Call PCPT for more information.

Emergency Ride Home Program

When you use PCPT to get to and from work at least two days a week, you are eligible to register for the Emergency Ride Home Program. This program guarantees you a taxi ride home for family emergencies, personal illness or unscheduled overtime. To register, please call the Tampa Bay Area Transportation Authority at 1-800-998-7433.

Wheelchair Information

Wheelchair passengers should arrive at their bus stop a few minutes early and position the wheelchair to clear the lift or ramp when extended. Follow the operator's instructions for safe boarding. When inside the bus, the operator will assist you with the safety belt system. If unable to pull the cord, please advise the operator of your destination.

PCPT Services

Public and specialized transportation services are provided by the Pasco County Board of County Commissioners through Pasco County Public Transportation (PCPT).

Services include: transit, paratransit advance reservations, scheduled pickup points, group and individual travel, and prearranged special assistance.

Various fares are available for the public transportation service. Please refer to www.ridepcpt.com for a listing of the most current fares, or call PCPT at the applicable number for your area.

Transit

Monday through Saturday—check individual route schedules for times.

Paratransit

All trips are reserved in advance.

Access for the Disabled

PCPT buses are designed to ensure persons with disabilities are provided equal access. Persons needing assistance may bring a Personal Care Attendant (PCA) and pay the applicable bus fare. When calling to arrange your paratransit trip, please inform the operator that a PCA will be traveling with you so that we may better accommodate you.

Bus Rules

- Children under eight must be accompanied by an adult.
- Passengers are responsible for their own packages.
- Tips and gratuities are prohibited.
- No playing of audio equipment without headphones.
- No eating or open drinks.
- No smoking.
- Shirts and shoes must be worn.



Paratransit Advance Reservation Services

Registration

Call the PCPT information number and an operator will determine your eligibility for subsidized rides on this service. Eligibility is determined through an application process, which begins with the operator's phone survey and may require you to complete a written application. Use of transit service may be more appropriate for some riders.

Reservation

Call the PCPT trip reservation number between 5:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, to schedule your appointment. ADA eligible passengers can call on Saturday and Sunday. Reservations made one day in advance are required for most trips. Agency-sponsored medical transportation may be requested up to two weeks prior to date of appointment.

Paratransit Onboard Rules

- Standing is not permitted when vehicle is in motion.
- Riders should be ready 60 minutes before their scheduled pickup time.
- Riders cannot change destination with the driver. Please coordinate any changes with the reservation center.
- There is a limit of three standard-sized shopping bags per person.
- Seatbelts must be used by all passengers.
- Children must use appropriate car seats on paratransit vehicles.
