Flood Warnings Issued for Parts of Pasco County

~~Significant River Flooding Expected~~

PASCO COUNTY, FL ---- The National Weather Service has issued **River Flood Warnings** for three rivers in Pasco County. The warnings will remain in effect from Monday morning until further notice.

- **Anclote River at Elfers** – At 3:00 a.m. Monday, September 11, the river was at 19.0 feet. Flood stage is at 20.0 feet and the river is forecast to rise above flood stage by Monday morning and continue to rise to near 26.5 feet by Tuesday evening (September 12). - **Cypress Creek at Worthington Gardens** – At 4:00 a.m. Monday, September 11, the river was at 8.9 feet. Flood stage is 8.0 feet. The river will continue rising to near 14.4 feet by Wednesday evening (September 13), then begin falling. For more information on Cypress Creek, visit <http://bit.ly/2ckXFyq>
- **Withlacoochee River at Trilby** – At 3:00 a.m. Monday, September 11, the river was at 11.6 feet. Flood stage is 12.0 feet. The river is forecast to rise to near 15.8 feet by Tuesday morning (September 12). Additional Withlacoochee River information can be found here: <http://bit.ly/2wSWj7U>
