County Offices to close for New Year's Holiday

PASCO COUNTY, FL ---- Pasco County Government offices, including the Constitutional Offices and the Courts, will be closed on Monday, January 2, 2017 in observance of the New Year's Holiday. All government offices and the courts will reopen on Tuesday, January 3, 2017.

The Pasco County Tax Collector's Office will be closed on Saturday, December 31, 2016 and Monday, January 2, 2017 in observance of the New Year's Holiday. The office will reopen on Tuesday, January 3, 2017.

All Pasco County Libraries will be closed on Saturday, December 31, 2016, Sunday, January 1, 2017 and Monday, January 2, 2017 in observance of the New Year's Holiday. Pasco County Libraries will reopen on Tuesday, January 3, 2017 with regular business hours.

The Pasco County Parks, Recreation, and Natural Resources' Offices and Recreation Complexes will be closed on Saturday, December 31, 2016, Sunday, January 1, 2017 and Monday, January 2, 2017; however, the parks and beaches will remain open to the public from dawn to dusk.

The Pasco County Animal Services Administration Office, Adoption Center, Intake/Reclaim Shelter and Field Services will be closed Monday, January 2, 2017 in observance of the New Year's Holiday. An Animal Control Officer will be available for emergencies only. The Adoption Center & Intake/Reclaim will be open Saturday, December 31, 2016 from 12 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. Pasco County Animal Services will resume normal business hours Tuesday, January 3, 2017.

Pasco County Public Transportation (PCPT) will be closed and no bus service will run on Monday, January 2, 2017 in observance of the New Year's Holiday.

The Pasco County Resource Recovery Facility, West Pasco Class III, and the East Pasco Transfer Station will be closed to the general public on Monday, January 2, 2017; however, they will be open to Pasco County licensed commercial haulers. The Resource Recovery Facility, West Pasco Class III, and the East Pasco Transfer Station will reopen to the public on Tuesday, January 3, 2017.
