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Pasco County Reduces Fees to Encourage Economic Growth

~~Updated Mobility Fee Ordinance offers savings for new economic development projects~~

PASCO COUNTY, FL ---- The [Pasco County](#) Board of County Commissioners is reducing some of the fees associated with new development to encourage economic growth in the county. The board passed the [2018 Mobility Fee Ordinance Update](#) at its regular meeting Tuesday, December 11, 2018. Mobility fees are one-time impact fees on new development projects that help fund necessary transportation systems such as sidewalks, bus stops, and roads.

“The Mobility Fee Ordinance encourages an efficient, safe and predictable transportation system and fosters job creation and economic growth,” said Pasco Planning and Development Director Nectarios Pittos.

Pasco was one of the first counties in Florida to adopt the award-winning Mobility Fee Ordinance in 2011. The Ordinance is updated every three years to account for an increase in growth rates.

The 2018 Mobility Fee Ordinance Update includes the following incentives and more:

- Vacant lot owners within the Vacant Incentive Zone save 75 % of the mobility fees they would normally pay to develop their property.
- Rural lot owners (greater than 5 acres) pay reduced fees depending upon the size of their overall property.
- Mobility fee administration fee is reduced to \$136.
