New Management Renovating SPCA Suncoast

New Port Richey, FL – The SPCA Suncoast is turning over a new leaf this spring.

The west Pasco animal shelter, located at 7734 Congress Street, is under new management this year. The staff and leadership team, with assistance from Pasco County Animal Services, will host a week-long restoration and training event from June 2 to June 8. The shelter will be closed to the public for the week to enable volunteers to attend orientation sessions, clean, paint, repair and upgrade the buildings and grounds. The public is invited to attend the grand reopening at noon on Sunday, June 9.

“We’re thrilled to be reorganizing and revitalizing this outstanding facility,” said Shelter Manager Margaret Milone. “The SPCA Suncoast serves a vital need in our community and we’re committed to running a top-notch shelter program.”

Thanks to generous contributions from the community, the SPCA is also planning major renovations including installing new flooring and state-of-the-art kennels in their main building. The new kennels are expected to be completed later this year.

The SPCA Suncoast is a 501(c)3 non-profit, no-kill shelter serving west Pasco since 1964, providing care and finding homes for more than 500 abandoned and unwanted dogs and cats annually.
