

Pasco Emergency Business Grant Reaches Capacity

Applications for Pasco County small business grant are no longer being accepted

PASCO COUNTY, FLORIDA (April 22, 2020) — The Pasco Emergency Business Grant has now reached capacity. At this time, the Pasco EDC has received over 1,400 applications and will no longer be accepting new applications. All submitted applications are currently going through a thorough vetting process and applicants will be notified of their status in the near future.

“We are proud to have offered this resource to the Pasco County business community,” said Bill Cronin, President/CEO, Pasco EDC. “The response we have received over the past day and a half shows us there was a need and we are glad to be able to partner with the county to step up and help.”

Pasco EDC partnered with Pasco County to provide this RELIEF grant to small businesses impacted by COVID-19 through Penny for Pasco funding. The Pasco Emergency Business Grant is an emergency grant up to the amount of \$5,000 to support small businesses and the local Pasco County economy. The funds will be distributed on a first-submitted, eligible and approved application basis.
